

## **Discipline Support Module Administration - Slalom**

This document outlines the administration requirements for course organisers running the British Canoeing Awarding Body Slalom Discipline Support Module:

- Course Authorisation is required by Directors prior to running the module; this
  is obtained through the Delivery Centre Coaching Office, and must be
  requested at least 14-days in advance of the course.
- The British Canoeing Canoe Slalom Technical Manual is to be distributed to candidates by Directors at the start of the module. Directors obtain the manual on memory stick from their Delivery Centre, along with the required form outlining the conditions of use.
- Candidates must register for the module with their Delivery Centre prior to attending the course. Candidates register via the Delivery Centre Membership Portal. The registration process checks that candidates have the necessary prerequisites.
- At the point of registration, the following prerequisites are required:
  - Registration Fee for Delivery Centre Members;
  - A British Canoeing Awarding Body Coaching Qualification;
  - Age 16 years of age, or older.
- It is important that Directors check that candidates hold the necessary
  prerequisites. These will be checked by the Delivery Centre. Only candidates
  who have registered will be acknowledged by the Delivery Centre as
  completing the training.
- End of Course: The Director should upload the course results to the Delivery Centre Membership Portal within 7 days of the end of the course.



- After completing the course, candidates receive a letter confirming attendance.
- During the course, Directors will provide candidates with the British Canoeing Awarding Body Slalom Discipline Support Module Logbook. Candidates who successfully complete the logbook, return this to their Delivery Centre for certification.
- Directors must be registered with their Delivery Centre as a recognised British
   Canoeing Awarding Body Slalom Discipline Support Module Director.
- The Ratio for the Discipline Support Modules is 1 registered Director, with a
  minimum of 4, and Maximum of 12 candidates (if working with more than 8,
  technical support is required from a discipline specialist). Directors must seek
  permission from their Delivery Centre if they wish to run courses outside these
  ratios.
- Applications for new Directors are processed through the Delivery Centres.
   Applicants who meet the following requirements will be considered:
  - Current British Canoeing Awarding Body Performance Coach (or equivalent qualification/experience);
  - Recent experience of educating Coaches (Coaches without tutoring experience are encouraged to support as a second member of staff);
  - Varied discipline coaching experience, including 6 session progressions;
  - Thorough understanding of tactical, technical, physical and psychological requirements of beginner Slalom paddlers.



New Directors are required to complete Delivery Centre Orientation prior to delivery.
